eGovernment 2020 - A Scenario-Building Colloquium

Dear Colleague:

On behalf of our international research team, I am delighted to invite you to attend a scenario-building colloquium for the Roadmap 2020 E-government research program, to be held on Wednesday afternoon, May 24th 2006 from 2 pm to 5 pm in the dg.o conference hotel. The E-government 2020 research program is an international partnership sponsored in part by the European Commission and led by the University of Koblenz-Landau in Germany. This symposium is organized in partnership with the Center for Technology in Government - University at Albany, and will be led by the research partner from the Technical University of Delft in the Netherlands. There is no fee.

Our aim in this session is to identify key research challenges for governments in the year 2020 and beyond. It is one of several events held in different countries that will construct alternative scenarios of society and government 15 years from now and identify the research questions that will need to be addressed in moving toward a desirable future. This will be the only such event held in the United States. Participants from all countries are encouraged to participate. It will begin with a presentation of influential trends and developments collected by the international research team. We will then elicit and discuss the ideas and reactions of the participants. The outcome will include both positive and negative future scenarios and research questions that will need attention in order to move toward the positive future visions and avoid the negative ones.

All participants will receive a report of the colloquium as well as the final eGov2020 project report containing the "Research Roadmap" that results from the entire set of international workshops.
