#### General

### eGovRTD2020 Workshop: Future scenarios of eGovernment 2020

eGovRTD2020 is a project funded within the 6th FP of the EC ([www.egovrtd2020.org](http://www.egovrtd2020.org)). It aims at identifying and characterizing the key research challenges, required constituency, and the implementation model for a comprehensive European initiative on holistic and dynamic government 2020. The vision is to transform the European Government landscape into a coherent community anticipating customer needs and leveraging the potential of the diversity and innovativeness of public agencies, and transforming the Union to the world leading knowledge society.

The workshop is being carried out in the phase of workpackage 2 with the aim of developing visionary scenarios for eGovernment research 2020.

The workshop will start with short presentations to provide insight into the state of play and aim of the scenario workshops. Afterwards, the workshop participants will be divided into small groups to elaborate potential future scenarios of Governments 2020. In the concluding round, the small groups will present their scenarios. In the discussion, these scenarios will be validated and assessed in respect to their potential of becoming the reality in about 15 years from now.
